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HISTORY

Amanzimtoti

Meaning 'Sweetwaters' in Zulu, this popular holiday town attracts beach lovers year-round. It has a rich history and it's believed to have been named by the famous King Shaka during one of his campaigns. Shaka was brought a calabash of water to drink and, upon sipping it, he commented 'Kanti amanzi amtoti' meaning 'the water is sweet'.

Winkelspruit

This popular seaside holiday destination is north of the Illovo River. It earns its unusual name from the Afrikaans word 'winkel' meaning 'shop'. This dates back to 1875 when sailors set up shop on the riverbank, selling waterlogged goods from the shipwrecked schooner, Tonga, on the riverbank.

Warner Beach, forming part of the coastal town of Kingsburgh, is situated between the adjacent coastal areas of Winklespruit to the south and Doonside to the north. It is a seaside village with a residential area and tourist, educational, and shopping facilities. Surfing conditions are



excellent at Warner Beach, which is why this coastal village has created some of the best surfers on a global scale.

Illovo Beach

This is an idyllic seaside village with the beautiful Illovo Beach on the banks of the Illovo River. It's named after the 'mlovo' trees growing along the river banks. Despite its convenient location, Illovo is away from bustling hubs and offers a tranquil retreat.

Umgababa

This rural KZN South Coast destination is named after the Zulu word meaning 'my father's wife' situated on the river of the same name.

Clansthal

This is a former German-American mission town that has become a prime beachside destination, with the Green Point lighthouse a popular attraction. The Clansthal Conservancy, between the Mahlongwana and Mahlongwa rivers, is a jewel of the Upper South Coast, protecting the area's rich biodiversity.

Adams Mission

Established as a medical settlement by American missionary Dr Newton Adams, it was destroyed by Dingaan before being rebuilt in 1839. Dr Adam's medical skills benefitted British colonists, Boers, and indigenous residents, with Adams College established in his honour in 1853. Its alumni include presidents of Botswana and Uganda, ministers and leaders of the ANC.

Umbumbulu

Named for the Zulu phrase, meaning a 'round knoll', Umbumbulu is surrounded by farming communities with the Ntinyane River flowing through. It was the site of local conflict in the 1970s and 80s, with hundreds murdered and thousands displaced from the area.



OCEAN ACTIVITIES

The warm Indian Ocean found along the Sapphire Coast makes this a top seaside destination for domestic and international tourists. The subtropical climate means sunny skies and temperate conditions yearround, with seaside activities plentiful. Amanzimtoti Main Beach is a hub of ocean fun, with children particularly drawn to the fun slides at Splash Water World. There are a variety of restaurants, takeaways, and shops to be tried and explored along the bustling promenade with local traders selling beautiful crafts and curios.

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Those looking for a family-friendly, beach holiday will enjoy the golden sands and warm waters for swimming, snorkelling and boogie boarding. The many rock pools dotted around the coast are ideal for little ones to explore, with surfing and kite surfingpopular sporting activities older family members.

Charter boats are available to take anglers out for a day of deep-sea fishing, while rock and surf fishing remains a popular pastime among the locals as well. There's also the option of horse rides on the beach with experienced guides catering for a range of abilities.





DIVING Umkomaas

Located on the Mkhomazi River, for which the town is named, Umkomaas was formed in 1861 when the harbour (now disused) was built to export sugar. The estuary here was used as a nursery for whales, prompting the name uMkhomazi – place of the cow whales. In 1944, the village was the site of a fatal crash of a War Hawk Air Force Plane after a mid-air collision.

Aliwal Shoal

This Marine Protected Area (MPA), found just off the coast of Umkomaas is considered one of the world's top warm water dive sites, attracting intrepid scuba divers from around the world to its spectacular marine ecosystem. Charter boats are available to take divers to the magnificent reef, alive with colourful corals, reel fish, turtles, whales, rays and moray eels.

Divers are drawn to the clear, warm waters that provide incredible visibility across the reef's intricate gullies and caves where Zambezi and tiger sharks frequent. There's also the must-visit Raggie's Cave famed for its ragged-tooth sharks, moray eels, and potato bass. Heading over to The Outside Edge, there's even more marine life to see such as game fish and dolphins.





SARDINE RUN

The Sapphire Coast plays host to one of the world's most spectacular natural phenomena on the globe – the annual Sardine Run. Every year, in the winter months between May and July, billions of sardines (also known as pilchards) make their way northwards along the coastline heading towards Mozambique.

Swimming close to shore, the sardines attract seine netters, anglers, and even residents keen to catch a few of these delicious fish. But beyond the delicious dishes they make, sardines also attract other

natural predators in the form of game fish, dolphins, whales, sharks, and sea birds overhead. This makes for some spectacular snorkelling, diving, and boat excursions along the Sapphire Coast.

Local lore has it that when the beach aloes bloom, the sardines are coming. It is believed that the more the aloes flower, the more fish there will be.



CONSERVATION

The popular Crocworld Conservation Centre, home to a variety of animal species in a beautiful setting, with an on-site restaurant, is the ideal spot for a meal with a sea view. Stroll through the beautifully-landscaped gardens, which is home to a variety of indigenous and endemic vegetation.

The centre is best described as a reptile and bird park with a botanical feel and a strong focus on adding value to visitors experiences through interaction with the natural surroundings and rare animal interaction opportunities.

It is home to a wide variety of reptile species which includes snakes, lizards tortoises and most famously crocodiles after which the centre is aptly named. Henry, the oldest resident crocodile, is estimated to be over 120 years old!

Crocworld is the place where everyone can immerse themselves in- and reconnect with nature.











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BIRDING

The Sapphire Coast Birding Route

One of the country's best-kept birding secrets, this incredible route winds along the Sapphire Coast, stretching from the eziMbokodweni River in the north to the aMahlongwa River in the south, about 9km inland from the coast. It has everything from coastal birds and forest specials to soaring raptors – an amazing birding experience! Top birding sites include: Umbogavango Nature Reserve, Vumbuka Nature Reserve, and Amanzimtoti Bird Sanctuary in the north to Empisini Nature Reserve in the south.

Those in the mood for a leisurely afternoon outdoors should head to Amanzimtoti's lagoon. Illovo River is another top spot for water sports, fishing, birding, and picnics.







Rare Sightings

The area features diverse habitats, with nearly 270 bird species recorded and rarities or out-of-range species spotted on more than one occasion. The iLovu Estuary mouth is one of the best locations for beach birding on the KwaZulu-Natal South Coast! Species you might expect to see in the area include the Half-collared Kingfisher, Mountain Wagtail, Black-throated Wattle-eye, Olive Woodpecker, Magpie Mannikin, and the annual winter visitor, the Spotted Ground Thrush.

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GOLF

Amanzimtoti Country Club & Conservancy

Opened in 1915, this club has a variety of amenities including a bar, two function venues (for up to 100 people), a Pro-shop, Driving Range and a Halfway House offering breakfasts, lunch and catering facilities. The beautiful 18 hole golf course will test experienced golfers looking for a challenging coastal game as well as holidaymakers seeking a fun round. There are enough carts to accommodate large groups.

The golf course is also a Conservancy and hosts a large variety of birdspecies along its coastal and river areas, such as Pelicans, Cormorants and Fish Eagles and a variety of smaller species of birds, buck and monkeys. Umkomaas Golf Club

Umkomaas Golf Club was first constructed as a 9 hole layout in 1913 but was expanded to 18 holes in 1926. In 1932 reknowed course designer "Bob" Grimsdell re-designed the course capitilising on the natural contours of the land and taking advantage of the glorious sea views – most holes offer great views of the warm Indian Ocean. The course has remained largely unchanged and, as a result, one of the courses unique features are the raised greens, thanks to 100 years of top-dressing and treatment.

Although not overly long, the course offers a great challenge for low handicappers, especially when the coastal winds blow. It is however forgiving for an occasional golfer, making it the perfect option for families and groups. It's a thinking golfers paradise, which has produced many good players such as Tim Clark, who was a regular of the PGA tour, winning The Players Championship tournament in 2010.

Umkomaas is a great choice for those wanting to get the whole family out into the fresh air. It offers exceptional family membership packages and the opportunity to learn to play via a KidzGolf program every Saturday. Parents are able to sit at the Hole in One resturant enjoying a breakfast or an early morning coffee, watching their children being taught the basics of golf.

Living up to a reputation as the Friendlest Club, Umkomaas offers a warm welcome to visitors both on and off the course. Competitions are held weekly on Wednesday and Saturday and visitors are always welcome.

SPORT

Amanzimtoti Sports Centre

This centre strives to provide the best facilities and a safe, secure, clean environment for the local sporting and recreation community to enjoy. It is set in a tranguil valley bordering the Amanzimtoti River and is a real gem, offering a variety of sports codes from the Hutchinson Park base. These include:

Trail runners and bird watchers will enjoy the trails offered by this sports centre, with beautiful walks along the Amanzimtoti River. Despite being in the middle of a coastal town, the trails will make visitors feel like they're lost in a coastal forest. Expect to see some beautiful sightings including the Cardinal and Golden-Tailed Woodpecker, Mountain Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, and Spotted Ground Thrush.

A number of outdoor gyms are located at Athlone Park, Amanzimtoti Main Beach, Hutchinson Park and Umgababa amongst others in the region.

An Olympic size public swimming pool was opened at Umgababa in 2021 and is a popular training ground for lifeguards and local swimming clubs. There is also a children's paddling pool with slides.

PARKRUNS

The Sapphire Coast plays host to two Parkruns every Saturday: Amanzimtoti Parkrun and East Coast Brewery Parkrun.

These are free, fun, and friendly 5km events where participants can walk, jog, or run. Both events start at 8am with the Amanzimtoti Parkrun meeting at Beach Road, while the East Coast Brewery Parkrun is from the brewery on 1 Oak Street, Ilfracombe in Umkomaas.
