Established in 1961, Bluff Nature Reserve proudly stands as Durban's oldest avian haven. Its storied past and diverse ecosystem makes it an absolute must-visit destination for nature enthusiasts.

Originally, this expansive wetland sanctuary stretched uninterrupted across the landscape. However, the construction of Tara Road bisected the area, with the majority of the Vlei now situated to the east of this busy thoroughfare.

Bluff Nature Reserve is a haven for a myriad of bird species, offering extensive roosting and breeding grounds for various herons, egrets, African spoonbills, and other species. In recent years, the breeding patterns within the reserve have predominantly favoured by species like Egyptian and Spur-winged Geese, Swamp Hens, and Coots.



Whaling History

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HERITAGE

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The industry in Durban started in 1907 when the Norwegian Consul in Durban, Jacob Egeland, went back to Norway and, with fellow Norwegian Johan Bryde, raised money to start a whaling operation in Durban. Durban was once a busy centre of the whaling industry. Thousands of migrating whales were caught in the seas nearby and towed back here to be processed into a number of products which were highly prized by consumers, both local and overseas. The whaling season in Durban lasted from March to September because whales would migrate northward past Durban at the start of the Antarctic winter and pass by

on their way south again. In 1922 Jacob Egeland ended his partnership with Johan Bryde and started the Union Whaling and Fishing Company with his cousin Abraham Larsen, turning it into the biggest and most advanced whaling station in the world. Thankfully Whaling in Durban stopped in 1975 and a vision was born for the Bluff Whaling Station.

At the heart of this achievement lies the historic Bluff Whaling Station, situated on the Bluff Headlands, once the world's largest of its kind. Here, we aim to showcase not only our Whale Heritage but also our rich Cultural and Military history. This attraction will be a cornerstone of Sodurba's Maritime Heritage Route, seamlessly weaving together our past, present, and future. Visitors will gain insights into science, conservation, tourism, and the profound connection between our local communities and the iconic humpback whale.

Every June, we celebrate this vibrant conservation spirit with the Annual 'Welcoming of the Whales™ Festival.' It's an event for the entire family, offering both fun and education. Our artistic projects, such as "Echo" , "Destiny" and "Infinity" where local artists, including school students and local companies, craft whale sculptures from plastic bottle tops, embody the creative spirit that drives our commitment to the oceans.

WESSA TREASURE BEACH

The Treasure Beach Environmental Education Centre on Durban's Bluff is rich in history and ecological importance. It is also the site of the original radar tracking station for coastal defence during World War II and has one of the last remaining patches of coastal grassland. The Centre has been operational since 1985 and offers a wide diversity of educational experiences to all ages. The roof of the building can be used by our guests as a viewpoint to watch whales and dolphins moving up and down our coast, while enjoying tea and scones. This can be combined with an interpretive stroll in their patch of unique Coastal Grassland (led by a guide). Good birds, insect life, and photographic opportunities!



TEMPLES

The cultural tour of temples showcases the level of culture and religious observance and is imbued with a desire to satisfy the spiritual yearning made from great efforts to establish places of worship and to follow the practices and usages that were carried out in places like India. 

In Hindi, "Mandir" translates to temple, and "Gowshala" signifies a cow protection facility. Central to Hindu culture, the cow is revered as a mother, symbolizing nourishment and life. The Shri Sivan Soobramoniar Alayam, situated at 21 Bidar Road in Merebank and established around 1975, stands as a testament to the dedication of its founding devotees and local residents. This temple emerged in an economically challenged community, leading to numerous fundraising endeavours to create a permanent space for cultural and religious pursuits. Through years of unwavering effort, a thriving spiritual hub took shape.




